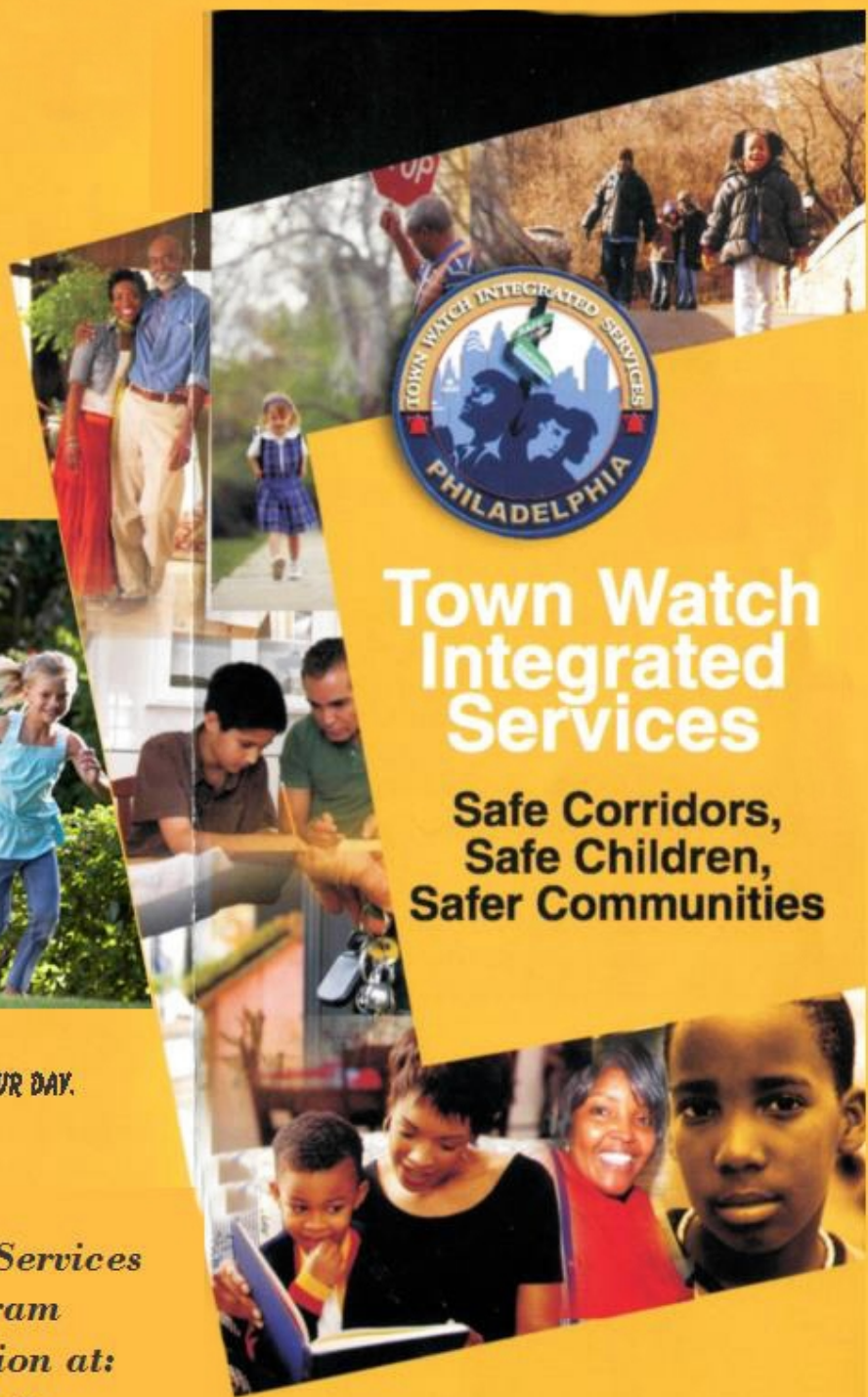
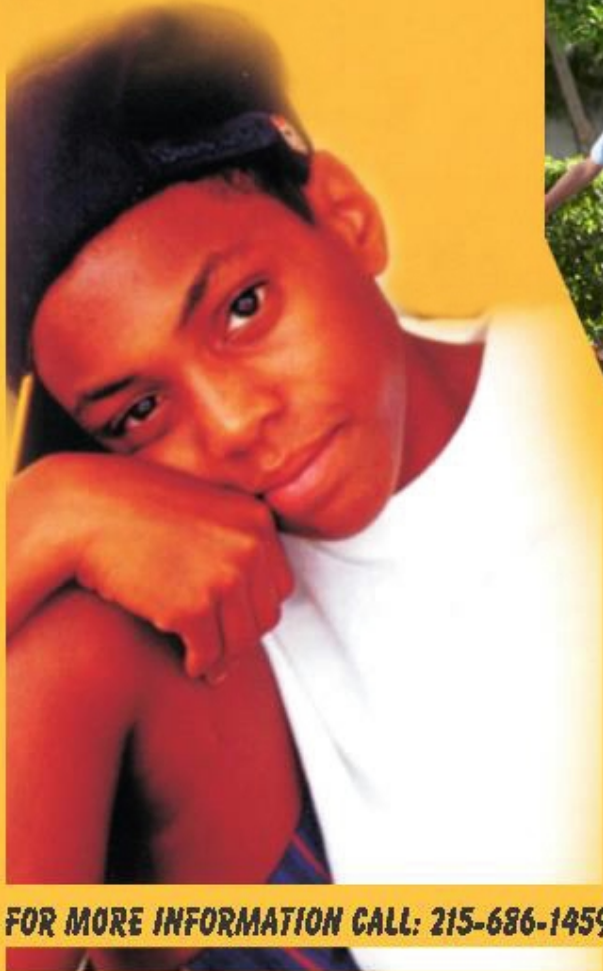

# Volunteers Make It Work! Here's how to get started...



## The Safe Corridor Program

is a volunteer run safety effort. Parents and residents of the school community who wish to form a Safe Corridor for their school will receive assistance from Town Watch Integrated Services. The Town Watch staff will provide training, resources and equipment to those volunteers committed to making a difference in the community for the children's sake.

## Volunteers

are required to attend 4 hours of training on Observation Skills, Communication, the 911 Emergency System, Patrolling, Radio Use, First Aid and, most importantly, Working with Young Children.

*The goal is to get the children from home to school and back again safely.*

Those who are unable to monitor the children, but wish to help, can volunteer to be a Safe Haven (only public facilities -no homes) along the safe corridor route. Safe Havens are businesses that are available to help children in the event of an emergency.



## What is a Safe Corridor?

The Safe Corridor Program provides a particular route by which school children will travel to and from school.

This route or Corridor is monitored by volunteer adult patrols who help to assure that the children arrive safely at their destination.

## Teach the Children

The school children will be taught that the corridor has been established for their protection. They will learn to recognize Safe Corridor volunteers and to look for Safe Havens along the route.

As the children come to understand the role that the volunteer patrols play in keeping them safe, they will also learn that they share a certain responsibility for safe behaviors.

Most young children are exposed to Danger Stranger instructions at an early age. This helpful information can be lost in the rush to get home from school or to get to the first class of the day. Safe Corridor Patrols take the time to observe who and what are a part of their surroundings to ensure safe arrival of our children

needs volunteers who want to make a contribution to the future of the community. This commitment to the children is a commitment to the continued growth and improvement of our communities.

## Safe Corridor volunteers

are a source of comfort for parents unable to monitor their child; and, for those children who can benefit from the concern of another adult.

It takes a village to raise a child, and it takes a community to keep them safe and protected. Safe Corridors, volunteers are doing their part to raise a community of children who are secure in their importance to the community.
